

DRIVE OF DAY SEEKS \$35,000 FOR SUFFERERS

Duluth Asked to Respond Generously to Halt Starvation.

Awakened by repeated disclosures of the atrocities practiced upon the unfortunate Christians of the far east by Hun and Turk, Duluth people are to raise before nightfall today \$35,000 toward the purchase of food for the Armenian and Syrians. The one-day drive, first of its kind with the exception of a whirlwind Boy Scout campaign last year, will be under the direction of captains and teams, comprising scores of the leaders of Duluth business and professional life.

Starting yesterday morning with a dollar given by a boy only 12 years old, the fund accumulated during the day without any soliciting being done. A girl brought 50 cents to the headquarters in the subtreasury, Third avenue West and Superior street. S. B. Coplowish, in a letter sent to Mayor C. R. Magney, regretted that he would be unable to act as a solicitor because of necessary business out of the city, but enclosed a check of \$15 with the remark, "the drive for the benefit of our unfortunate brothers and sisters in the east is a most worthy cause, and I am confident that the good people of Duluth will respond generously. It is our privilege to see that they live to enjoy the democracy that the flower of our country died for."

Minnesota's quota in the drive is \$715,000, that of the United States being \$30,000,000. All of the money is to be spent to buy food, none going for administration expenses.
