

ALLEGED SWINDLER

IS DUE FOR EXTRADITION

ST. PAUL, Oct. 15.—The story of \$10,000 "perfect paper money" swindle charged by Louis Roth, a Chisholm merchant, against Solomon Rubiloff and G. Green, was repeated with variations at the capitol today when C. H. Troyer, St. Louis county deputy sheriff, presented an application for the extradition of Rubiloff, now under arrest in Chicago. Governor Burnquist granted the requisition.

When Rubiloff was arrested about a month ago in a Chicago synagogue, Roth, at Chisholm, told newspaper men he had been swindled by a man claiming to be a "rabbi," who fainted while near an open safe containing the \$10,000. According to Roth's story at that time after the so-called rabbi fainted, the latter was left alone in the room, allowing him an alleged opportunity to switch a bundle of blank paper for the package containing the \$10,000, while Roth went for water to revive him.

In his affidavit made public at St. Paul yesterday Roth admits he was the victim of a worn confidence game.
