

STOLEN GOODS FOUND ON ROAD NEAR CHISHOLM

Discovery Is Made After Superior Barber Is Examined as Material Witness.

CHISHOLM, Nov. 26.—Will the finding of two bundles containing goods it is said, stolen from the Shanedling store in Virginia last Wednesday night by burglars, free Robert Daly, Superior, Wis., barber, arrested Monday in Eveleth on a charge of being implicated in the crime and given a hearing yesterday in Virginia?

Daly denied all knowledge of the burglary, though furs similar to those stolen from the Virginia store were found in his suitcases. He produced witnesses, men from Superior, who gave testimony that Daly was in Superior on the night of the burglary and his wife testified she had helped him pack the furs before he left for the Mesaba. Daly himself asserted he had bought the furs last July, and his wife corroborated him.

Tonight new element of mystery entered into the burglary when the two bundles were found on the Hibbing-Chisholm road by George Drayton of Chisholm. Drayton discovered them after he had gone to the aid of two men in an automobile which had been stuck in snowdrifts.

Chief Witte came here for the bundles, one of which contained furs and other women's dressing apparel. He said they were goods stolen from the Virginia store.
