

IRONWOOD TAX IS \$692,573.14, LARGEST EVER

**Oliver Iron Mining Co. Will Pay
Almost Half, \$346,059.91.
Schools Get \$193,445.**

IRONWOOD, Mich., Dec. 3.—City tax rolls have been placed in the hands of the city treasurer for collection. If paid before Jan. 9, they will carry a charge of 1 per cent. After that date and until March 1 the collection fee will be 4 per cent. On March 2 all unpaid taxes will be declared delinquent.

The total city tax this year is \$692,573.14, the largest in the city's history and the largest of any city in the upper Michigan peninsula. The tax rate on a valuation of \$25,194,750 is \$27.50 per thousand.

The apportionment follows: City tax, \$250,000; school tax, \$193,445; one mill school tax, \$25,194.75; county tax, \$73,860; state tax, \$99,848.59; county road tax, \$50,224.80.

The Oliver Iron Mining company will pay a total of \$346,059.91, or approximately 50 per cent of the entire levy. Of this sum, \$120,065.76 is for personal property; \$69,007.03 is the tax on the Aurora-Vaughn property; \$55,330 on the Morris property, and \$73,906.87 on the Pabst mine property.

The Ironwood & Bessemer Railway and Light company will pay the third highest tax of any corporation, its tax quota being \$6,185.29. The Scott and Howe Lumber company, is fifth, with a tax of \$4,893.24, and the Gogebic National bank is sixth, with \$4,398.77. The Roach & Seeber wholesale house is next with \$2,804.05. The Merchants and Miners State bank stands ninth in the list with a tax of \$1,751.19.

D. M. Glassner, who owns the block now occupied by the Sullivan, and Coumbe grocery store, the Metropolitan stores and the W. D. Triplet jewelry store, will pay a tax of \$1,642.41 on an assessment of \$60,000. Davis & Fehr pay \$1,286.53 on their building and stock; S. S. Curry pays \$1,146.39 on his real estate and personal property, and James Devoy \$962.16 on the building occupied and under leases to Gamble & Mrochak, the James A. Sullivan Insurance agency and the Joe Anderson meat market. Con Geary and Martin Brogan rank fourteenth and fifteenth respectively in the list of high taxpayers.
