Small fruits, chiefly berries, are suitable for growing in Duluth, and many valuable hints as to the proper methods of handling their production was given. Mr. Mackintosh was brought to Duluth under the auspices of the Twentieth Century club. Last night he repeated his talk in Cloquet, also at the request of the club.
