

# CENTRAL IN DOUBLE WIN FOR TROPHY

## Debaters of Hillside Are Victorious in Two Out of Three Contests

Duluth Central high school debating teams last night assured title to the Garon trophy cup, in the annual triangular contests between the three big interscholastic institutions of the Twin Ports.

Debating on the question, "Resolved, That the United States Government Should Own and Operate the Railroads," the following decisions resulted:

Duluth Central affirmative team defeated Superior Central negative team at Duluth Central auditorium.

Duluth Central negative team defeated Denfeld affirmative team at Denfeld auditorium, West Duluth.

Superior Central affirmative team defeated Denfeld negative team at Superior Central auditorium.

Both Duluth and Superior Central have registered single victories to their credit in previous contests. The provision of the awarding of the cup is that it will become the property of the institution first winning it twice.

### Duluth's Double Victory.

Duluth Central, therefore, had but to gather one victory, though she clinched the argument by establishing a double win. This made a total of three victories for Duluth Central, two for Superior Central and one for Denfeld.

Unanimous decision was accorded Duluth Central in her contest with Superior at the local school. Members of the Duluth affirmative team were Harry Levine, Grace McDonald and Herman Griffith, while the Superior trio was made up of Archie Siegel, Richard Smith and Morris Karon. Judges were Supt. of Schools J. E. Lunn of Biwabik; Prof. A. D. S. Gillet of Superior and H. C. Fulton of Duluth.

### Close Debate at Denfeld.

The debate at Denfeld was much closer. Members of the winning Duluth Central negative team were Dorothy Kearns, Evelyn Mooney and Dabo Shama, while members of the Denfeld team were Haven Hanscom, Arthur Ness and Edith Thodeen. Judges were W. I. Prince of the Duluth Commercial club, Rev. W. W. Lawrence of the Presbyterian church, and Austin L. Cathers, local attorney.

The debate at Superior was very close, also, the members of the winning Superior affirmative team being Lowen Merrill, Raymond McDonald and Robert Sher, with the Denfeld trio being made up of Lillian Holcomb, Leonard Hendricksen and Leonard McDougall.
