

WALLACE CUP IS GOAL OF DULUTH

Twin Ports Double Event to Be Held May 16—Four Schools Are Represented.

The date for the annual Wallace cup oratory and declamatory contests was set yesterday as May 16. Students from the four high schools at the Head of the Lakes, Duluth Central, Denfeld, Superior Central, and Nelson-Dewey of Superior, will take part.

The rule of the event is that one school shall win it at least six times out of the 10 to become the permanent possessor of the cup. According to this, a victory by Superior Central, which has won in five contests, would determine its title to the cup; whereas should Duluth Central win, with four victories to its credit, that would postpone the settlement of the claim until next year, and place Duluth on equal terms with Superior Central.

Ten Have Been Chosen.

Ten students for oratory and 10 for declamatory have been selected at Central for the semi-finals. The date for the oratory finals has been set for April 24 and for the declamatory tryouts April 25.—At this time four students from each division will be selected to appear in the finals which will be given during chapel exercises at the school May 2 and 5. This event will decide who is to represent the school in the oratory and declamatory in the Wallace cup contest.

The 10 students who are in the semi-finals for declamatory are Margaret Cheadle, Grace McDonald, Helen Robinson, Ruth Miller, Sylvia Josephs, Charlotte Lugoff, Gertrude Brooks, Anna Banks, Blanche Hutchinson and Marvin Oreck. The coaching will be done by members of the English staff and will be supervised by Miss Southworth.
