

## TRACTION HEAD DRAWS FINE LINE IN STRIKE

NEW YORK, Jan. 1.—At the trial of John J. Dempsey, vice president of the New York Consolidated Railway company, when a street car wreck killed 100 passengers, in 1918, the accused denied he ignored a decision by the national war labor board that 29 victimized members of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers be reinstated.

"The board did not make a decision in this case," said Dempsey. "The board made a recommendation." A strike following the company's refusal to reinstate the brotherhood men. The company placed a green man in charge of a train, and the management's obstinacy destroyed 100 lives because of the wreck.

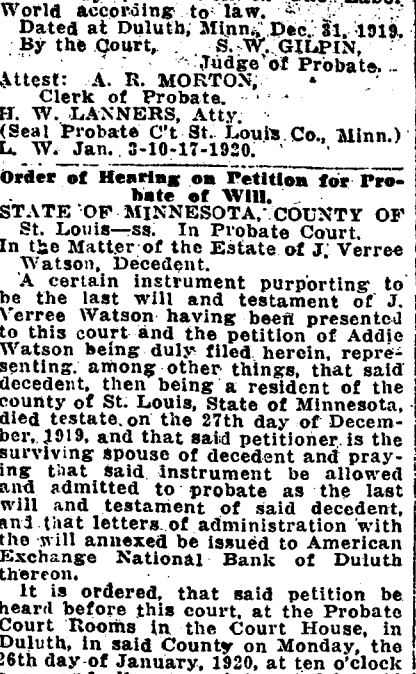

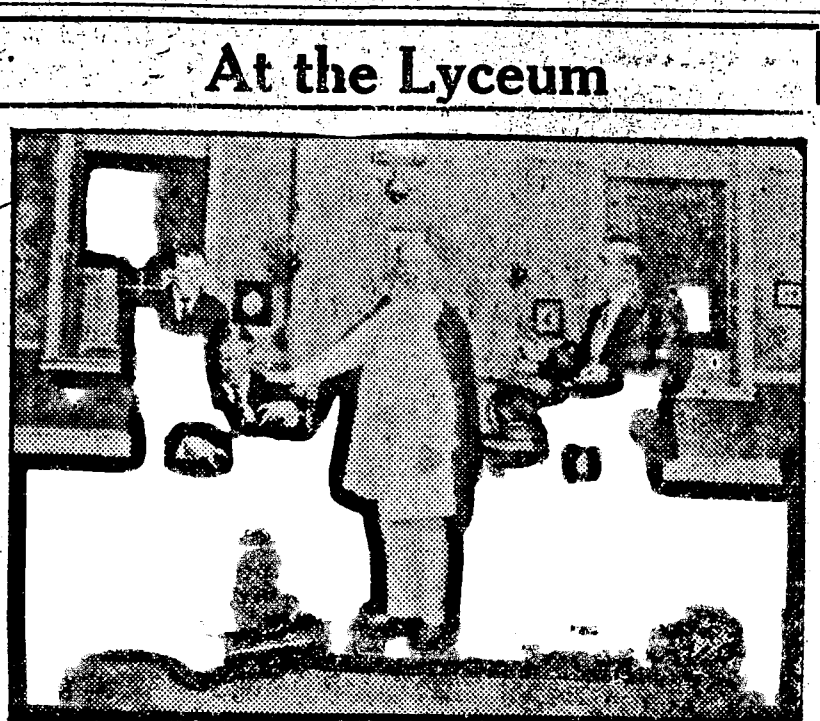
