

DULUTH SYNAGOGUE BENEFICIARY IN WILL OF WEALTHY REALTOR

Charles P. Oswald, wealthy real estate man, who died at Barron, Wis., Aug. 6, 1919, left a will in which \$50 is donated to the Temple Emanuel Jewish synagogue of Duluth, \$100 to the synagogue cemetery association and \$1,000 in a trust fund to provide for the upkeep of the Oswald lot in the cemetery.

Louis S. Loeb and Samuel Loeb of Duluth are named as executors of the will. Other bequests include sums varying from \$50 to \$100 to charitable institutions throughout the United States. The bulk of the estate is left to Mrs. Sally Manheim at Rice Lake, Wis., but an estimate of the value was not filed.
