

IMPROVEMENTS OCCUPY TIME OF CITY COMMISSION

Council Holds Quiet Session. Many Applications for Li- censes Approved.

Consideration of 1920 street improvement projects, license applications and petitions for improvements were the business subjects before the city council yesterday. Petitions were received from residents on east side of Fourteenth avenue East between Ninth and Tenth streets, asking that an 11 foot building line be authorized.

Property owners petitioned for a sanitary sewer in Oneida alley from Forty-seventh to Fiftieth avenue East. Both petitions were referred to J. A. Farrell, commissioner of public works.

The Standard Oil company was granted a three-months temporary permit for the erection of a filling station at the curb at Tenth avenue West and Michigan street. The company announced its intention of erecting a permanent filling station at that point, similar to the other buildings which it now has in other parts of the city.

Upon a motion of Commissioner Farrell, \$185.87 was appropriated from the permanent improvement fund to pay the city's share of turnpiking Gold street from Carver to Montrose avenues. The employment of John McKenzie, his engineer and pile driver at \$34 per day to repair the south approach of the Sixth avenue viaduct was authorized.

Repair Incinerator.

Commissioner W. F. Murnian of the public safety division was authorized by an emergency ordinance to issue warrants for the payment of the Deetz Sheet Metal & Roofing company \$225, and Baxter Door & Sash company \$604.39, for repairs made to the city incinerator which was damaged by fire recently.
