

EUROPEAN CONDITION WORSE: THAN IN 1914, SAYS JUDGE

That suffering Europe is in worse condition now than in 1914 is the declaration of Judge Harry M. Fisher of Chicago upon his return from a recent trip abroad. Judge Fisher will lecture in Duluth at the Shrine auditorium Sunday night at a mass meeting which will open the campaign in Duluth to obtain \$25,000 for relief of sufferers in Europe. In his trip abroad which extended for a period of seven months, Judge Fisher visited Poland; Rumania, the Ukraine and soviet Russia. The fund for the entire country is set at \$40,000,000.
