Mr. and Mrs. Silberstein were married on Oct. 9, 1870 at Detroit by Rev. Dr. Kohler, now the president of the Cincinnati university. They came immediately to Duluth to make their home.

Mrs. Silberstein has been prominent in the social and club life of the city. Mr. Silberstein is one of the most public spirited citizens of Duluth and has held many civic offices. In 1898 he was appointed park commissioner and served for 20 years. He also served two years on the library board and was commissioner of public safety for four years.
