

# EVELETH CHILD; GILBERT MAN IN LONG FALLS, BOTH MAY DIE

Two persons in northern Minnesota may die as the result of long falls yesterday.

One is Jean Mesberg, 3, daughter of George Mesberg, Eveleth merchant, who fell from an upper story window of her home, landing on a paved sidewalk. She suffered a broken leg, badly bruised face and head and probably internal injuries.

The other is Ernest Kruger, who fell 40 feet, landing flat on his back, while working on the trestle of the Hobart mine, Gilbert. He is suffer-

ing from temporary paralysis of the legs.

With another man, Kruger was attempting to put a dump car back on the track. Both men were on the end of a long pry. Kruger's helper left the pry for a moment to put in some blocking. Then Kruger shot up and over the guard rail.

Kruger is married and has one child. Prior to his employment in the Gilbert mine, where he has worked for 18 months, he lived in Wisconsin. He served one year in the army during the war.
