The wood-work here, as on the interior, is mahogany. The interior walls are in two tones of antique gray, with cream cellings. Sidewall bracket cream cellings. Sidewall lighting has been arranged, with fixsizns.

The ventilating plant is one of the features of the house. The air is taken in at a point high above the street and after filtration to remove dust and other impurities, is carried over tempering coils which cool it in summer and warm it in winter. It is then distributed throughout the theater in ducts along the ceiling. The outtake is at the door, forcing a real circulation.
