
DULUTH B'NAI B'RITH HONOR BERNARD SILBERSTEIN

The greatest meeting ever held in the history of Covenant Lodge of Duluth, and probably the most notable affair ever staged by the Jews in that vicinity was the meeting and banquet held Sunday, May 1, when the Duluth B'nai B'rith honored Bernard Silberstein on the occasion of his jubilee as member of the I. O. B. B., which he joined fifty years ago in Detroit, Mich. Gathered at the in Detroit, Mich. Gathered at the Spalding Hotel, three hundred Jews of Duluth and vicinity gathered to do him honor and to hear some splendid tributes paid him. The principal speaker was Henry Monsky, of Omaha. Chas. Kapplin, chair-man of the Jubilee Committee which arranged the details of the celebra-tion paid a glowing tribute to Mr. Silberstein, and presented him a certificate of life membership in the I. O.
