

Truck Marooned in Snow; Boys Battle Drift With Shovels

Driving a truck loaded with 3,500 pounds of fish, two Duluth boys struggled for two days with snow drifts in covering eight miles of road between a little fishing village and the main county highway running through Two Harbors.

Harry Goldish and Neil McKenzie left Duluth Sunday noon for Castle Garden, a little village of eight families on Lake Superior.

"We got as far as Castle Garden without any trouble Sunday afternoon, landed 3,500 pounds of fish on the truck and started back for the main road," said Goldish. "Two miles from the village we got stuck in the snow. There was neither a machine nor an animal in the village to take us out. We tried to get some one on the main road, walking six miles to get there but were unsuccessful. We started to dig ourselves out. We had to work for practically every foot we covered, taking turns sleeping in the driver's box on the truck when night came."
