

Spanish Veterans Oppose War Bonus

The John G. McEwen camp of the Spanish American War veterans, with the Ladies' auxilliary will turn out in a body for its Armistice day parade, according to a decision made last night. The camp drum corps will be in the line of march. A banquet was served 200 veterans and members of the auxilliary at the Memorial hall of the county courthouse.

"It has been reported that we were to discuss the question of a bonus for the Spanish war veterans," Harry Witz, commander of the camp said. "We did not discuss it and I believe I am voicing the sentiment of all the veterans when I say we do not want a bonus. We do want uniform pension laws to provide for those of the veterans who are unable to take care of themselves and the orphans and widows that need assistance."

M. P. Orchard was presented with a past commander's badge. The presentation was made by P. J. McCormick. Col. C. C. Teare gave a short address on Armistice day. A musical program was given followed by games under the direction of J. R. Batchelor, city recreational director.
