

Jews of Duluth Open Campaign for Quota of \$14,000,000 Fund

Mass Meeting at Shrine Auditorium to Start Drive.

Max Korshak, a Chicago attorney, will be the principal speaker tonight at the Shrine auditorium, when a campaign for the Duluth district of the American Jewish Relief committee will be opened. The quota for Duluth is \$20,000, besides an additional \$10,000 to be subscribed for local work of the United Jewish Charity agencies. I. Freimuth, member of the local organization, announced yesterday.

The nation's quota for the drive is \$14,000,000 to be used in rebuilding and rehabilitating Europe and to care for 300,000 war orphans and homeless children.

Mass Meeting Called.

The mass meeting will begin at 8 p. m. In addition to the speakers, a musical program will be held. Other speakers on the program include Judge W. A. Cant, Duluth; Dr. Alvin S. Luchs of Temple Emanuel and Rabbi I. Lebendiger of the Hebrew Institute.

The entire city has been organized and captains named for the various districts, according to C. D. Oreckovsky, secretary of the organization. A meeting also is scheduled for today at the Hotel Spalding, where team captains will be given final instructions and pledges received.

"The drive is an emergency which has arisen and I am confident that the Jewish people of Duluth will raise the quota which has been set for the city," Mr. Oreckovsky said last night. "The \$14,000,000 to be raised by the nation will require every person of Jewish parentage to contribute \$4. We hope to complete the drive in a week."
