## County to Clear Snow.

Logan and Tower avenue roads leading to cemeteries on the outskirts of Superior are the only highways the county will keep free of snow during the winter months. This announcement was made yesterday by Charles D. Conkey jr., county highway commissioner. The Logan avenue road leads to the Swedish, Norwegian and Jewish cemeteries and the Tower avenue road to Greenwood cemetery.

## Five Cases Booked.
