

Women of Hibbing Protest Cut in "U" Appropriation Act

HIBBING, April 12.—Resolutions calling for the revision of the present University of Minnesota appropriation bill in the legislature and to assist the local post of the American Legion to form a women's auxiliary were passed by the women's community council at the meeting held at the public library club rooms last night.

The University appropriation bill was recently cut from \$9,000,000 to \$5,000,000, and the revision asks for an additional \$1,500,000. That the state University will lose its biggest instructors and the school itself will deteriorate is almost certain unless sufficient funds are granted by the legislature, was brought out at the meeting. Four telegrams will be sent to members of the senate and house urging the revision measure.

Israel Sher, as a representative of the local American Legion post stated the aim of organizing a women's auxiliary in Hibbing, and the plan was indorsed by the council. The delegates will introduce it at the meetings of the various organizations, asking for their co-operation.

Plans for a membership drive were discussed and the president was given power to appoint a committee, to formulate details.

Telegrams to Representative Theodore Christianson chairman of the house appropriations committee, Senator A. J. Rockne, chairman of the senate appropriations committee, and to the representatives and senators of St. Louis county, addition of \$1,500,000 to the appropriation which the legislature proposes to allow to the University will be sent by the Minnesota University Alumnae Club of Hibbing.
