

Women to Have Voice on Juries in Range Courts.

28 Chosen to Sit With Men in Municipal Court Panel.

VIRGINIA, Minn., May 26.—The first women jurors to be selected on the Mesaba Range, were named on the municipal court list of one hundred jurors today. Twenty eight out of the one hundred named are women.

The event marks the first appearance of women into court room circles. Only two of the women selected are unmarried.

Many of the women selected for the panel, when asked their opinion of women on the jury, said that in their estimation a woman would be just as capable of weighing legal matters as a man. One declared it would be easy for her to sit on a jury with eleven men and act fairly and squarely without any embarrassment. "Decisions will be more typical of everything that is clean and right," another declared.
