

THREE INJURED, SUNDAY TOLL OF AUTO ACCIDENTS

Car Driven Into Ditch When Passing Auto; Man Is Struck.

Three persons were injured last night as the result of automobile accidents.

Mrs. Harry Schappery, 613 East Third street, and Mrs. Sam Polinsky, 119 Third avenue East, were slightly injured at 1:15 p. m. yesterday when an automobile in which they were returning to the city from funeral services at Jewish cemetery went into a ditch on Vermilion road near the end of the Woodland avenue street car line.

Benjamin Collop, driver of the auto, last night declared he had been forced into a ditch by a car, driven by a woman, when he attempted to pass. Both injured women were taken to St. Mary's hospital. Mrs. Shappery was bruised about the lower limbs and Mrs. Polinsky about the face.

Arthur Garceau, age 52, 109 Eighth avenue East, was seriously injured when struck by an automobile driven by Paul Weatherby, 1018 East Third street, at Fourteenth avenue East and London Road. He was taken to St. Luke's hospital where attendants last night said the extent of his injuries had not been determined.

"The man was standing on the crossing and as my car approached he seemed to become confused," Mr. Weatherby told police officials. "Although I was driving at a reasonable rate, I was unable to avoid striking the man. He darted straight into the path of the car."
