Orthodox. We need both, and the Seminary is so poorly supported that the president has had to pay a deficit of \$20,000 out of his own pocket. They should support Palestine Development Corporations, the Jewish Publication Society and the National Farm School. In other words, they should be the mainstays of the spiritual development of American Jewry. Their financial investment would bring them large spiritual returns and rescue them from spiritual isolation.

"One final word: What the Jews of this country need is the stimulation that can come only from making them constantly conscious of their own capacity. This campaign has gone a long way toward accomplishing that, and to save them from lasping into the state in which we found them I would have frequent campaigns. There are many good causes to which the Jews of this country can and should contribute in much larger measure than they do now. And by giving to all and in large measure they will then become those fine, upstanding self-confident communities which they should be as integral parts of the American people—as conscious, loyally Jewish communities.
