### Clubs

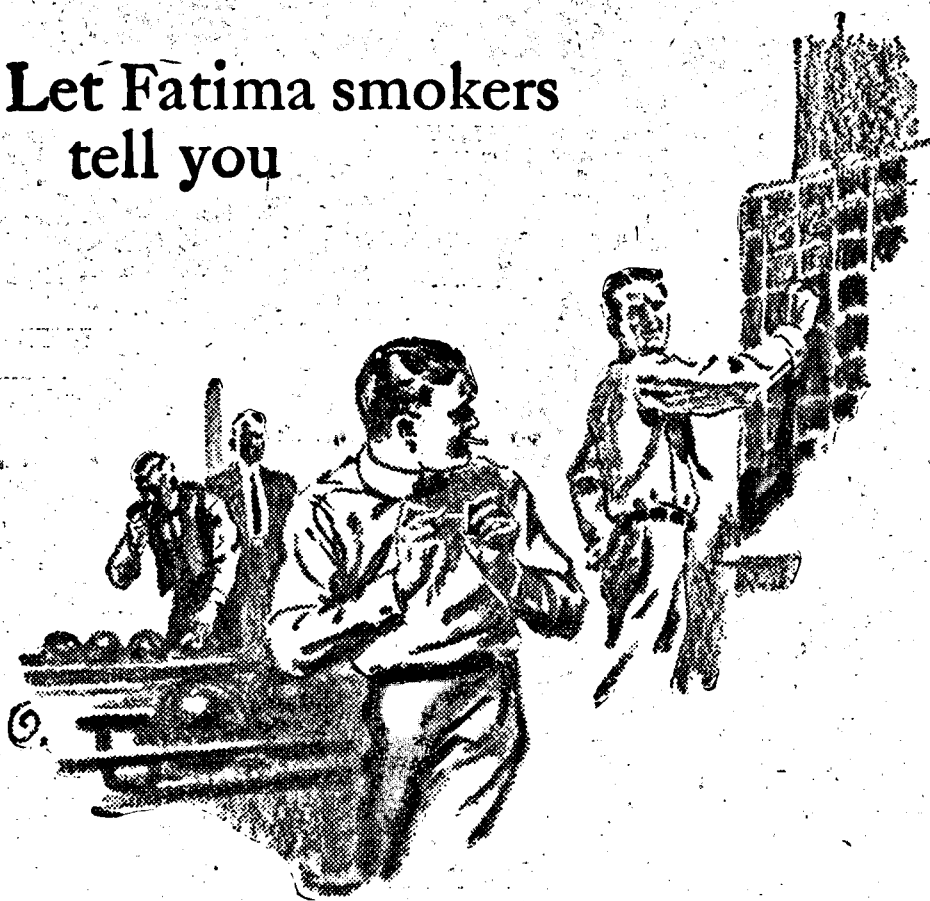
The Council of Jewish Women held their regular monthly meeting on Wednesday, April 5. Mr. G. G. Glick was the principal speaker.

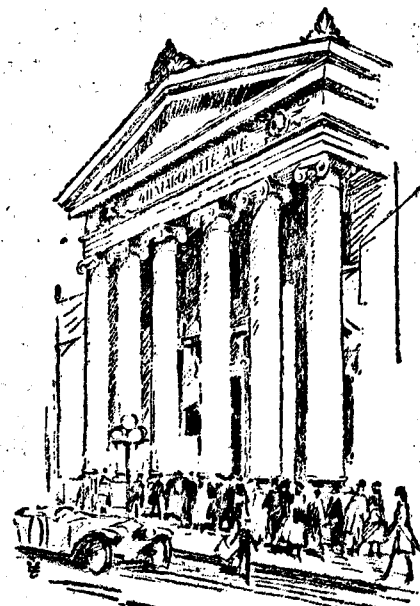
