

# Robbery Victim Hopes for Arrest to Clear Up Case

Hope that an arrest within the next day or two, would be made in connection with the robbery of his jewelry store, 502 West Superior street, which the police declare to have been an "inside" job, was expressed by Harry Witz at his home at 1825 Greysolon road last night.

"The great loss which I have sustained, was not enough. On top of that, there had to be all the publicity. The whole affair came as a shock and I have been under terrible nerve pressure since the thing happened," Mr. Witz said last night.

"We are not accusing anybody of the crime," Capt. F. A. Schulte, chief of the detectives, said last night, "but it is our opinion that the safe was first looted and then blown. A rather extraordinary procedure for a cracksmen."

Had the robber opened the safe by means of the combination it is not probable that he would have taken chances on blowing it to make it appear as the work of a safe-cracker, is the opinion of the police, who say the noise of the explosion would have materially increased his chances of being caught.
