

# WOMEN ORGANIZE FOR ACTIVE COMMUNITY CHEST DRIVE

Every housewife, unless, she is being imposed upon, has an allowance of some kind, even if it is only money for the movies and the like, Mrs. A. T. Banning, director-chairman of the community chest campaign for the residential districts east of the Point of Rocks, said yesterday in outlining her plans for the campaign.

"The work of the organizations participating in the community chest is, it seems to me, from the very nature of things, closer to the hearts of the women than it is to men and it will be the purpose of those engaged in the campaign to give every woman in Duluth the opportunity of making her own individual contribution to the fund," Mrs. Banning said.

"More than half of the charities and social agencies to be taken care of by the community chest are operated by women," Mrs. Banning said, "and I might say that it is no small part which the women of the city have played in the history and development of these organizations, so, of course, every woman will want to make her individual contribution to the fund."

Since the organization of the women to take charge of the campaign in the residential sections at a meeting at the Chamber of Commerce on Monday, 13 district directors have been appointed, a director-chairman elected and more than 280 women enlisted to serve as sales-women-solicitors, who will make a house to house canvass, beginning with the opening of the campaign on Tuesday, and, during the four days thereafter.
