

New Rabbi Formally Assumes Duluth Post

Rabbi David Aaronson of New York has officially accepted the call of the Hebrew institute, 310 East Third street to succeed Rabbi Israel Lebender who has resigned to assume charge of a synagogue in St. Louis.

Rabbi Aaronson studied at the Maat Elchanan Talmudical college and the Jewish Theological seminary of America where he was ordained a rabbi. He is a graduate of New York university and has received his master degree in philosophy at Columbia university. During the war he served as resident chaplain under the auspices of the Jewish Welfare board at Camp Upton. Rabbi Aaronson was head of the Conservative congregation in Salt Lake City where he organized the Young People's Hebrew association and was active in Bnai B'rith, Zionist and Americanization work.

Activities at the Hebrew institute are being gradually taken over by the new rabbi. The traditional daily and Sabbath services are conducted as usual. Special services for the children of the Hebrew and religious schools are held every Saturday morning. New pupils for the Sunday schools will be accepted until Nov. 26, Rabbi Aaronson announced.
