

Medical Men Pledge Russian Hospital Aid

Five hundred dollars was pledged for the relief of medical men in Russia by the members of the St. Louis County Medical society following an address by Dr. Michael M. Zlatovsky at the meeting of the society at the Chamber of Commerce last night.

Dr. Zlatovsky, who came to Duluth recently from Petrograd, described the Petrograd hospitals before they were taken over by the Bolsheviks in 1917 and pictured the same hospitals in 1922 as devoid of all equipment after five years' of ruthless spoliation under the soviet regime. People dying of disease and suffering untold pain flee from the hospitals rather than remain in them, the speaker said. The pledges were taken up at the conclusion of the address upon the motion of Dr. W. H. Bagley, who will head the committee in charge of its expenditure.

Dr. Mary McCoy read a paper on "Some Results of Physical Examinations of Duluth School Children." Dr. L. A. Barney, read the scientific paper of the meeting. A motion was adopted to send Dr. Zlatovsky's address to the Minnesota Medical Journal for publication.
