LINCOLN'S BIRTHDAY and the Jewish festival "Chamishoh Oser B'Schvatt," the Jewish Arbor day, a festival commemorating the day when trees were planted in Palestine in Biblical times, will be celebrated at the Duluth He' -new Institute on Sunday, Feb. 12, in the form of an elaborate entertainment, which will be given in the morning at 10 o'clock for children and in the evening at 8 o'clock, for adults. This joint celebration is being planned by Rabbi Israel Lebendiger, who with the aid of his Hebrew and Sunday school teachers, and some of the board of directors, has been working for the past several weeks to make the affair the success it promises to be.

Leading features of the program will be the well-known Biblical story, "King Solomon's Trial," which will be dramatized by the children of the Hebrew school; a touching little play, "The Little Orphan Girl," with Lillian Harris playing the leading role; stereoptican pictures of Biblical scenes; a sketch, "Sammy's Chamishoh Oser Party"; some dancing and musical numbers; and an elaborate "Grand Finale" number, in the form of a "Song Revue," consisting of American and Zion songs, by the girls of the Sunday school dressed in pretty costumes. Miss Helen Segal, draped in the American colors, will represent "Liberty." Nathan Cohen, representing Dr. Theodore Herzl, the founder of Zionism, will bring a message from Palestine to Duluth's Jewry, and Rudolph Segal, Duluth's noted young orator, will deliver Lincoln's famous Gettysburg address.
