

15 NEW CASES SWELL MARCH COURT'S CALENDAR TO 267

Fifteen notes of issue for the March general term were filed in district court yesterday. Two filings for divorce are included in the number. The plaintiffs in the cases ask for damages totaling \$39,832.37. Yesterday was the last day in which notes of issue for the March term could be filed.

Two hundred and sixty-seven civil cases are to be listed on the March calendar of the district court, W. R. Wasson, deputy clerk of court said. The St. Louis county grand jury will meet March 1, in charge of Mason M. Forbes, first assistant county attorney. Judge H. A. Dancer will be in charge of the calendar.

George Dallaire, age 34, filed suit for divorce from Ida Dallaire, age 30, alleging desertion. Mike Degree, age 28, filed suit for divorce from Laura Degree, age 20, also alleging desertion. He asks custody of their child.

L. Singer and Sons filed suit for \$174.37 against Mandel Rice, charging merchandise sold to the defendant has not been paid for. Samuel Esp filed suit for \$1,150 against the Manhattan Oil company. He alleges that a truck driven by an employee of the company struck his automobile at Twenty-seventh avenue West and First street, Oct. 8, 1921. Dan Myhrman as father of Herbert Myhrman, age 7, filed suit for \$7,000 against R. D. Marshall, alleging that an automobile driven by Marshall struck the boy, causing him serious injuries. Mr. Myhrman filed a second suit for \$2,500 against Marshall, claiming he paid that amount for medical services during his son's illness.

Samuel L. Meyers filed suit for \$1,000 against Max Corson and Samuel Litman, alleging that the two men assaulted him July 6, 1921. Damages of \$7,700 are asked by Hans Lindquist from John Thorson, as proprietor of the Denver hotel. Lindquist claims that Thorson assaulted him in the hotel building, Dec. 14.

John S. Hedberg as father of Stanley Hedberg, age 20, filed suit for \$6,500 damages, against M. J. Mergener, alleging that an automobile driven by the defendant struck his son at Grand and Thirty-ninth avenue West, Dec. 10, 1921, causing him permanent injuries. Mr. Hedberg also filed suit for \$1,200 for medical services in the care of his son and for general damages.

Alleging that S. Zimmerman and M. Levinson, proprietors of the Duluth Army store, assaulted him and caused his arrest when he requested them to exchange a pair of trousers he had previously purchased, Andrew

Ryquist filed suit for \$5,000 damages. He claims that he was held in the city jail for two hours.

Ed Begin seeks to recover \$1,013 from Robert Armstrong and Frank Kane, alleging breach of contract. Hans P. Swanson seeks \$5,451 from Earl Stenberg, alleging that an automobile driven by the defendant struck him at Twentieth avenue West and Superior street, Sept. 1, 1921.

John Hurd claims that he went into a soft drink parlor alleged to be operated by James and Effie Conway, with \$995 in his pocket. He drank some moonshine whisky in the place and became intoxicated, he alleges. When he became sober he found that his money was gone. He filed suit yesterday to recover the money from James and Effie Conway.

Paavo Koponen filed suit against the Duluth, Winnipeg and Pacific Railway company for \$200, claiming that a locomotive, belonging to the defendant, struck and killed one of his cows.
