

## JURY IS UNABLE TO DECIDE IF CUSTOMER GOT HIS CHANGE

VIRGINIA, March 10.—After several hours deliberation a jury in municipal court, hearing the case of Gust Ericson against D. S. Scheibel, early yesterday, returned in disagreement.

The trial was the result of a sale in the store of the Palace Clothing company, of which Scheibel is manager. Ericson who is a woodsman, claims that, in payment for a purchase made March 13, 1919, he gave the store man a pay check for \$170.34, but received in return only \$30.

The jury was composed of Edward Wenzel, A. Hawkinson, William Rooney, M. S. Smith and J. S. Cherney and A. F. Thayer. Attorney Luke Burns appeared for the plaintiff and S. S. Dahl for the defendant.

The case of the state health department against Fred LeMoine of Cook, tried yesterday before the municipal court is still pending, Judge Bliss having the case under advisement.
