

DISTRICT GRAND JURY ENDS WORK IN RECORD TIME

Alleged Forger Is Indicted Two Hours After Arrest; Eight Indictments Returned.

Eight indictments were returned by the St. Louis county grand jury in a short and snappy session yesterday. Two no true bills were returned. Three were dismissed as two of the men are serving sentences at Red Wing, and one was sentenced in municipal court. For the first time in ten years, the grand jury completed its work in one afternoon, according to Mason M. Forbes, first assistant county attorney, who was in charge of the jury. The jury retired at 1:30 p. m. and returned at 5 o'clock.

Within two hours after his arrest, Ed Maloney was indicted by the grand jury on a charge of attempting to pass a forged check. He was indicted on a charge of second degree forgery. Maloney attempted to obtain \$43.90 on a check at the First National bank yesterday, it is alleged. The name of Ed Vertelney was signed to the check.

Burglary Charged.

Joe Serault was indicted on a charge of second degree grand larceny. He is alleged to have burglarized houses on Minnesota Point, Jan. 5. No true bills were returned in the case of John Bukoski and John McDonald, who were being held on the same charge.

Axel T. Sager also was indicted on a charge of second degree grand larceny. He is alleged to have stolen \$50 from Milo A. Newton Jan. 24. The money is alleged to have been taken by Sager from the wallet of Newton. Sager was holding for safe-keeping. Iver Jackson, alias Fred Jacobsen, was indicted on a charge of second degree forgery. He is charged with having forged the name of the Poirier Tent and Awning company on a \$25 check. The other four indictments returned were secret.
