

Mock Trial to Liven B'nai B'rith Program

Covenant lodge, B'nai B'rith will stage a mock trial Tuesday night at Covenant hall, 12 East Superior street.

The trial will be the feature attraction of the annual ladies' night entertainment for the members of the lodge and women folk. The mock trial will begin at 8:15 p. m. and will be followed by cards and refreshments.
