Bishop Makes Appointments.

Rt. Rev. Mgr. Charles J. Weber, pastor of St. Joseph's Catholic church, was named vicar general of the Superior diocese and Rev. W. J. Kubelback, appointed secretary to Bishop G. Pinten, newly appointed head of the Superior diocese. The appointments were announced yesterday by Bishop Pinten. Monsignor Weber was acting administrator of the Superior diocese following the death of Rt. Rev. Joseph Koudelka. Bishop Koudelka preceded Bishop Pinten.
