

Jewish New Year to Be Observed in Synagogues

All stores operated by Duluth Jews, including the large downtown department stores, will close Saturday, in observance of Rosh Hashonah, the Jewish New Year, it was announced yesterday by Rabbi Alvin S. Luchs of the Temple Emanuel congregation.

Beginning with sundown Friday, special services will be conducted in Duluth synagogues. The services will usher in year 5683. The Jewish calendar dates back to the beginning of the world in the Old Testament. Rosh Hashonah and Yom Kippur, or Day of Atonement, and the holiest of the Jewish holidays.

Schedule of Services.

Orthodox Jews will observe Rosh Hashonah, beginning Friday night and continuing through Sunday. Rabbi Israel Lebendiger of the Hebrew Institute said. Services will be conducted there Friday night, Saturday morning and night and Sunday morning. Rabbi I. Teplitz will conduct the services at the Adas Israel congregation.

Services at the First Unitarian church, conducted by Rabbi Luchs, will be held Friday night and Saturday morning. Reformed Jews observe Rosh Hashonah one day.

Yom Kippur, the annual fast day of the Hebrew race, will begin the night of Oct. 1, and continue until sundown, Oct. 2. Services in observance of the day will be conducted in all Duluth synagogues.
