

## Lone B on Record of Case Honor Grad

Being nearly perfect satisfies Louis H. Goldish, top student among the 283 seniors graduated by Case Institute of Technology yesterday.

Goldish, who lives at 4454 Silsby Road, University Heights, won highest honors with a 3.99 average out of a possible perfect 4.

Once, when he was a sophomore in physics laboratory, he got a B, and that was what kept him from perfection.

"It was a well-deserved B, too," Goldish said cheerfully yesterday as he stood in the graduation procession.

"I THINK IT kept me from having a nervous breakdown. After that I never worried again about spoiling a perfect record."

Case also presented 196 graduate degrees at the commencement exercises in Severance Hall.

The class heard a plea from Dr. Marcel Roche, graduation speaker, for them to use their knowledge and talents in the underdeveloped countries of South America.

Dr. Roche, who is director of the Venezuelan Institute for Scientific Investigation, said the scientist today needed a broad understanding of the human context of his work.

DR. ROCHE RECEIVED an honorary doctor of science degree from T. Keith Glennan, Case president.

Glennan also presented honorary degrees to Dr. Wolfgang K. H. Panofsky, director of the Stanford Linear Accelerator Center; Dr. Herbert A. Simon, dean of the graduate school of industrial administration of Carnegie Institute of Technology, and Dr. William Prager, L. Herbert Ballou University professor at Brown University.

Warren L. Morris, a Case trustee and founder and consultant of the Ostendorf-Morris Co. of Cleveland, received the honorary doctor of laws degree.

## Proper Gun Care Vital for Safety

Home safety should include a course in handling firearms, a national expert on safety said at the first Home Safety Workshop of its kind ever held here.

"There is an average of one firearm—pistol, rifle, shotgun—to every home in Ohio," said Phil Dykstra, home department manager of the National Safety Council in Chicago, at the workshop sponsored by the Greater Cleveland Safety Council in the Higbee Co. Auditorium.

HE RECOMMENDED a course covering special storage of firearms with ammunition elsewhere, the disassembling of guns, and the cleaning of weapons.

Last year 1,200 persons were killed by firearm accidents in their own homes, Dykstra said.

Among other safety measures he outlined to the representatives of organizations ranging from nurses to teachers were checks of home hazards and home fire drills.

A big problem in safety, an afternoon session decided, was to persuade people that accidents were not acts of God, nor did they "always happen to someone else."

## Hero Woodall in Florida, but Heart Is Here

Alphonso Woodall, Cleveland's heroic stunt man, is now in Florida staging kite flying exhibitions but his heart remains here, he wrote The Plain Dealer yesterday.

"Florida has objected to my advertising Cleveland," Woodall wrote. "They say it

should be Florida on my kite. I will stick by Cleveland."

Woodall, who won the Carnegie medal rescuing a fisherman from Lake Erie while still on crutches from a kite crash, flies hanging from a 43-pound kite labeled

Spirit of Cleveland.

He plans an attempt over the Caribbean to break his 32-mile flight record.

Last year he planned to fly the kite across English Channel, but gave up the project when a car whacked him in Piccadilly, London.

## Repp Re-elected

Lee Repp, in his 24th year as president of the Cleveland Federation of Musicians, was re-elected last night to the American Federation of Musicians executive board at its 66th annual convention in Miami. Repp was first elected president of the Cleveland local in 1939.

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## U.S. Ambassador to Bern Is Quitting

WASHINGTON (AP)—Robert M. McKinney is resigning as U.S. ambassador to Switzerland, informed sources said today.

McKinney, publisher of the Santa Fe New Mexican, has been ambassador at Bern since mid-1961.

MOSCOW (AP)—The Torfs, a tiny tribe of Siberian reindeer herders, has increased from 417 persons in 1926 to 650, a Moscow newspaper reports. Formerly nomadic, the Torfs now live in a Soviet-built village near Irkutsk, the newspaper said.
