## Amphetamines Put Under State Control

COLUMBUS (AP) — A bill that puts amphetamines under the state's drug laws was signed into law yesterday by Gov. James A. Rhodes.

Amphetamines, which includes a drug commonly known as "speed," will be covered by law governing barbiturates, which will take effect Nov. 19.

The bill establishes a

maximum \$1,000 fine and a five-year jail sentence for illegal sales or distribution. A second offense can bring a \$5,000 fine and 20 years imprisonment.

Another measure signed which goes into effect Jan. 1, 1970, will permit jail or workhouse inmates serving time for minor offenses to continue working during their stint behind bars.

SPONSORS SAID it would allow persons accused of crimes such as drunken driving, to serve their time at night and continue with their regular jobs during the day.

They said it will keep their families from suffering additional hardships.

Rhodes signed a bill which provides an additional municipal court judge for Bar-

berton and Dayton. It freezes at 13 the number of municipal judges in Cleveland.

The 1970 census is expected to show that this would mean that the Cleveland Municipal Court would lose one of its judges.

## Jewish Center Announces Changes in Assignments

## Convicted Rapist Is Granted New Trial

Richard L. Kinser, 27, serving a three to 20-year sentence in the Ohio State Reformatory, has won his fight to get a new trial.

The U.S. Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals in Cincinnati has ruled that Kinser's constitutional rights were violated during his trial for rape in 1965 and has ordered his release within 30 days unless the decision is appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court.

A spokesman for Cuyahoga County Prosecutor John T. Corrigan said yesterday Kinser will get a new trial.

"HE WILL BE removed to the County Jail to await a retrial," the spokesman added.

Kinser, a former Cleveland, was convicted in April, 1965, of the rape of a young Cleveland girl.

During the trial Kinser took the stand in his own defense but a codefendant, Albert E. Chapman, refused to testify.

The prosecutor commented to the jury on Chapman's failure to take the stand and the appeals court ruled that this remark had violated Kinser's constitutional rights.

Kinser petitioned the U.S. District Court here to grant his release but Judge Thomas D. Lambros denied the request. Kinser then appealed to the Sixth Circuit Court.

IN THEIR decision the appeals judges said it may "well have been the failure of Chapman to testify which tipped the scales in favor of Kinser's guilt."

The U.S. Supreme Court ruled in 1965 that the right of a judge or counsel to comment on the failure of a defendant to testify was repugnant to the due process clause of the U.S. constitution.

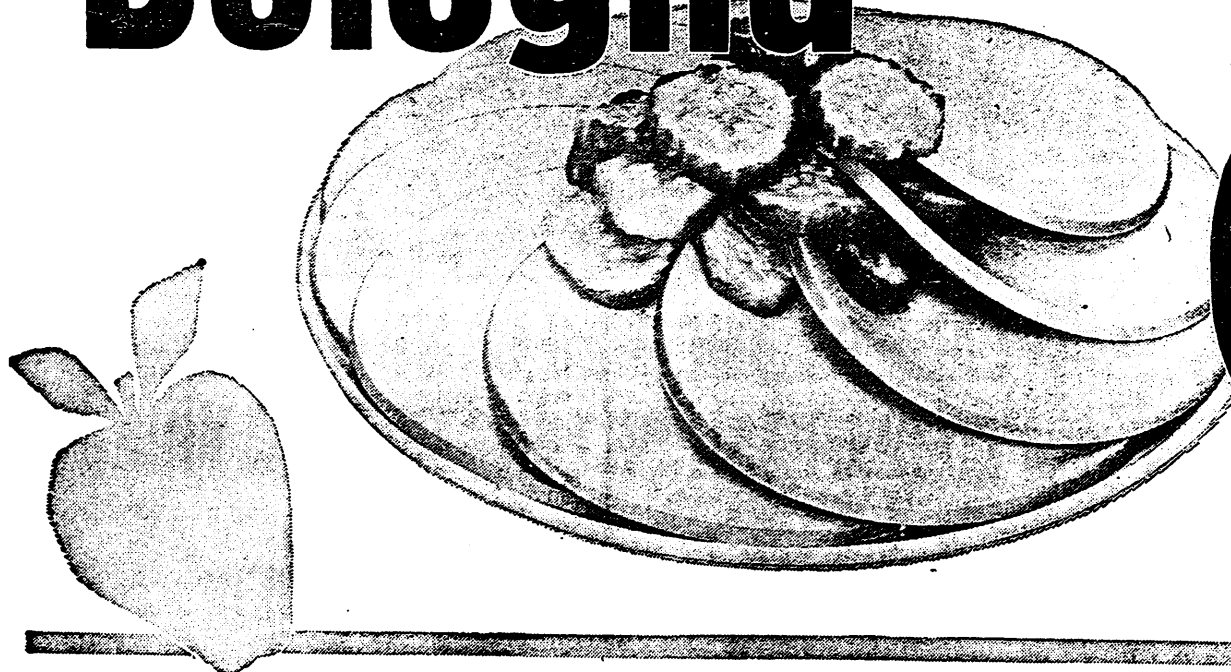

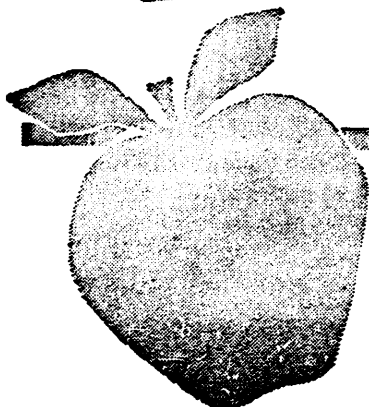
