## St. Peter Girls Decry Plan to Make School Erieview

Students at St. Peter High School are as upset by the creation of Erieview Catholic High School as their counterparts at Lourdes-St. Stephen High School.

The Board of Catholic Education announced last Tuesday that St. Peter, 1729 Superior Avenue N.E., and Lourdes-St. Stephen, 4105 Bridge Avenue N.W., both girls' schools, would be closed in June.

In their place next September will be created Erieview Catholic High School, using the St. Peter building. St. Peter and Lourdes-St. Stephen girls would be guaranteed admission to the school, which Catholic officials said would be "innovative and unlike anything else in the diocese."

DONALD GRAMATA, principal of Lourdes-St. Stephen, has been asked to be administrator of Erieview Catholic.

Sisters of the Holy Humility of Mary, now staffing Lourdes-St. Stephen, also have been asked to transfer

to Erieview Catholic. The Sisters of the Notre Dame, now teaching at St. Peter, are to be reassigned to Cleveland Central Catholic and Elyria Catholic High Schools.

Neither Gramata or the Lourdes-St. Stephen faculty, however, have made a decision yet whether to transfer.

But the junior class at St. Peter is quite upset, and a delegation came to The Plain Dealer to explain why.

"Everyone's talked about the poor girls at Lourdes-St. Stephen," said Cheryl Wojcik, a member of the student council. "But consider us. We're losing our name, traditions and our nuns. Who wants to be left with just a building?"

ALLISON GAWEL, also a student council member, said many girls cried Tuesday morning when the decision was announced by Msgr. William N. Novicky, diocesan superintendent of schools.

Lourdes and St. Stephen

were merged last year and students, and teachers there had expected a decision to be made on a replacement for the present 83-year old structure. The decision to close left them angry, surprised, and crying.

"We're upset here too," Miss Gawel said. "We know how those girls at Lourdes-St. Stephen feel, because we feel the same way."

The St. Peter's girls said they expect no trouble between the two groups when the new school starts in September.

"WE'D LIKE to have something left to us," one of the St. Peter girls said. "At least Lourdes-St. Stephen is supposed to bring its faculty with them."

Transfer of the Notre Dame order from St. Peter will also mark a turning point in its history. The Notre Dame nuns first came to Cleveland to teach at St. Peter elementary school, and their first provincial house, in use in 1878 until 1915, was on the site now occupied by the high school.

## ROTC Suffers Mass Desertion

man expressed the conviction that "current enrollment is more than adequate to meet all projected military officer procurement requirements."

In the school year ending in June 1968, the Army commissioned about 14,000 second lieutenants out of ROTC. That total rose to 16,606 in 1969 and dropped back to about 16,000 in the school year that ended last June.

FOR YEARS THE U.S. Military Academy at West Point, N.Y., on the other hand, produced only about 600 new officers each year out of an enrollment of 2,500.

Now, however, West Point has achieved a cadet strength of more than 4,000. By 1972 the academy will expand to the congressional authorized maximum of 4,417, as may both the Naval Academy at Annapolis, Md., and the Air Force Academy at Colorado Springs, Colo.

The smaller Coast Guard Academy at

New London, Conn., was not included in Congress' new enrollment authorization.

The other major source of Army officers, is the system of Officer Candidate Schools. In wartime it is often the largest source.

Initially OCS was projected to turn out 7,000 second lieutenants — nearly 50% of the ROTC total and about 11 times the West Point total — in the current fiscal year that ends June 30. Now, however, OCS totals have been trimmed to 2,000 in the face of an administration decision to reduce sharply the size of the Army.

This budget-induced loss of potential officer material by the Army puts a further burden upon ROTC, where last June only about half those commissioned were called to full terms of active duty. The rest served only six months on active duty and then were assigned to reserve units for the next 7½ years.
