

West Point's first black grad finally buried with full honors

THOMASVILLE, Ga. (AP) - Lt. Henry Ossian Flipper, the first black graduate of West Point who was dismissed from the Army in disgrace and buried without honors 38 years ago, returned home yesterday to a burial with full military honors.

A crowd of nearly 500 persons, including 18 family members from as far away as California and dignitaries from the U.S. Army and Georgia government, attended the graveside services at Old Magnolia Cemetery following a ceremony at the First Missionary Baptist Church

An honor guard from Ft. Benning led the two-block procession from the church to the cemetery in which a mule-drawn wagon carried the casket of the late lieutenant. A riderless horse followed in military tradition.

After his discharge from the Army, Flipper became the first prominent black civil and mining engineer in the United States and an assistant to the secretary of the interior from 1921 to 1923. He returned to Atlanta in 1931, where he lived until his death in 1940.

INTIL FRIDAY his remains lay in a grave at Atlanta's Southview

The 94-year fight to clear his name ended in 1976 when the Army chang-

ed his discharge to honorable. Born March 21, 1856, Flipper graduated from West Point in 1877. was commissioned a second lieutenant in the 10th Cavalry, and from 1878 until 1882 he fought in the Indian wars in the Southwest.

found innocent of embezzlement, but was found guilty of unbecoming conduct and dismissed from the Army.

In December 1976, at the urging of Flipper's family and Ray MacColl, a former Valdosta. Ga., State College student who is now a teacher, the Army reviewed the court-martial and changed Flipper's discharge

Flipper's body was exhumed and placed in a new casket Friday before being transported to Thomasville for the military burial.


