Nelson B. Moore, was public relations head for 2 decades

Nelson B. Moore headed one of Cleveland's rgest public relations firms for more than 20 ears, counseling numerous corporations, cluding Glidden Co. and Durkee Famous

Mr. Moore, 73, died yes-Mr. Moore, 13, tiest yes erday at Hillcrest Hospi-al of pneumonia and other omplications following reatment for an oral

He graduated with nors from Ohio Wesleyan Iniversity in 1934, where won numerous literary

nd other awards and Moore layed running back for the football team.

In 1938, he joined the staff of the Cleveland Press, where he served as a reporter, copy ditor and automobile editor. He represented Scripps-Howard newspapers as one of the first reporters to tour the facilities at Oak Ridge, enn., after the Manhattan Project to develop the atom bomb was revealed.

He founded Nelson B. Moore & Associates in 1946. Among the more unusual projects involving his firm were the introduction of the Carling "Bach Beer Festival" to Cleveland, a novel candy and packaging concept for the famous Whitman Candy Sampler and the worldwide introduction of the Glidden Spred family of latex paints.

Known for his ironic sense of humor. conceived a lid for Spred paints with the admonition, "Please use this revolutionary new paint as directed, or don't use it at all," to prevent homeowners from trying to thin the new water-based paint with oil thinners or

Mr. Moore helped establish the era of "big money" golf tournaments with the \$50.000 Carling Open. His firm was among the first to serve the health care business, representing St. Luke's and Windsor hospitals in the early

He also played a major role in defending Glidden Co. against a takeover attempt that resulted in the company's merger with SCM Corp. in 1967.

Other clients included manufacturers and marketers of recreational vehicles, mobile homes, steel office partitions, appliances and automobiles.

Mr. Moore eventually closed his firm and became an independent consultant to Glidden-Durkee, his first and oldest client, before retiring in 1976

He was a former director of the Hermit Club in Cleveland and a member of the Country Club in Pepper Pike.

He loved literature, linguistics and history. As a writer, he was a staunch defender of grammatical accuracy.

Mr. Moore is survived by his wife, Nilah Jane; son, Nelson B. Jr.; daughter, Judith Jane of Omaha; a brother; four grandchildren; and 12 nieces and nephews.

No services are planned.
