MADISON, Wis. — More than \$9 million awaits the holder of a Lotto America ticket purchased in Evansville, Wis.

Lottery spokesman Steven Madson said officials drew the ticket of the state's 20th Megabucks jackpot winner Saturday night.

He said the ticket was pur-

chased at a Gas 'N Go market in Evansville, Wis., a Rock County town located 17 miles northwest of Janesville.

The ticket, which has not been claimed, is worth \$9.2 million, Madson said.

Twenty three winners matched five numbers for \$642 each. Madson said 1,509 matched for \$28.

# Sports fan's kindness shined through

During the final moments of his life, John McGarry was doing what he loved.

Only four months earlier, in March, the 62-year-old had retired as a production manager at Town and Country Buyers Guide.

Friday, he was on the green at Sinnissippi Golf Course.

He had completed six holes and was getting ready to tee off on number seven. Suddenly, he had a heart attack, said his son, Michael McGarry. He died instantly.

"Mac," as he was called by his family and friends, loved to play and watch sports. He was a passionate Bears and Cubs fan, his family said.

At one time or another, McGarry coached girls' softball, Little League and headed up a Webelos troop for Cub Scouts.

"He did it all for the kids, so they could get involved," said his son, Michael McGarry.

McGarry had four children,

three sons and a daughter. "He was a big, macho guy, but here he was coaching girls softball," his wife, Mildred (Mellie), said.

McGarry spent four years, from 1949-53, in the Air Force. He spent much of that time fighting in the Korean War. That, however, was a subject that he didn't like to talk about.

Michael McGarry, 29, said he remembers seeing a picture of his young father during the war. He was surrounded by four buddies in a USO bar. After seeing the picture, Michael McGarry asked his father about his friends and the war.

"I was the only one (of the four) that returned," McGarry told his son. He said nothing more.

Outside of the service, McGarry spent most of his life working as an accountant for W.A. Whitney and Rack-Mac machine works. He got a degree from Rockford Business College, after graduating from St. Bede's Academy in Ottawa.

It was at the college that Mc-

Garry met his future wife. He'd always say, as soon as first saw me, "he was sunk," Mellie McGarry said.

But it took him a while to ask her out. "He was real shy," his wife recalled. "But I saw the kindness in him."

It was during holidays that his caring would often bubble over, said his daughter, Cathy Klein.

Perhaps the biggest holiday for the Irish-Catholic McGarry was St. Patrick's Day. Every year, corned beef, cabbage and green cake would be served. On March 17, his "Irish blue eyes" — as his daughter called them — were sure to shine.

But he also loved to spend time with his grandchildren at Easter and Christmas, she said. "His playfulness really showed for the first time around the grandchildren."

McGarry always had a stick of gum for each of his grandchildren, she said.

"He was really proud of them."

## Family's suit says Zenith TV caused fatal fire

BELLEVILLE — Zenith Electronics has been sued for more than \$10 million by relatives claiming a fire that killed an Osage County, Mo., family was caused by a defective color television.

The lawsuit, filed Friday in St. Clair County Circuit Court, con-

tends the four family members died Jan. 26 when the 25-inch set malfunctioned as they slept in their home near Linn, Mo. The victims were Robert and Brenda Morland, both 28, and their children Matthew, 4, and Megan, 5 days.

The lawsuit is the latest in a series of claims filed in recent years alleging that Zenith televi-

sions have caused fatal fires. Zenith, based in Glenview, has made several suit settlements and won others.

In an official report on the Morland blaze, an investigator with the Missouri Division of Fire Safety said the family's TV had been the likely cause of the fire.
