Harris Rosenberg.

What was probably the most largely attended funeral in the history of Minneapolis Jewry took place Sunday afternoon, October 31, at the Kennesseth Israel Synagogue, when the services were held for Harris Rosenberg, late of 1720 Elliott Avenue. Mr. Rosenberg had been killed instantly

on Wednesday, October 27, near Huron, So. Dak., when an automobile

in which he was riding overturned. Mr. Rosenberg was 58 years old and one of the pioneer Jewish settlers of Minneapolis. He had been active in the various institutions of the city, having at one time been vice-president of the Kennesseth Israel Synagogue. The esteem in which he was held was attested by the large throng that attended the funeral, the Synaauditorium being filled to capacity. Services were conducted by Rabbi S. M. Silber and Rabbi C. David Matt. Interment was at the O. B. A. cemetery. Mr. Rosenberg is survived by his widow, four daughters, Sarah, Eva, Anna, Mrs. Ben Nathanson, and two sons, Arthur and Hymen.
