

BRITONS TO EXTEND WAR RELIEF EFFORT

Will Work in Northwest, Says
Quail—Kodivrim Club Pledges
Fifty Dollars for Jews.

Tentative plans are being considered for the collection of funds in all the northwest states to aid British subjects abroad who are in distress as a result of the European war, according to David Quail, British vice consul in Duluth.

There is little definite information available as to the movement. Mr. Quail said last night, but within a few days the plans will be formulated, he expects. There is a possibility that Chicago will be made the headquarters of the committee which is to have charge of the subscription work.

In the fund started here Mr. Quail reports a total of \$450. A committee in Minneapolis also is working to obtain cash donations for British sufferers and a report from there is awaited daily.

Members of the Kodivrim club, an organization composed of Jewish young men and women, have pledged themselves to donate \$50 to a fund that will be directed to relieve European Jews.
