

HIBBING MEN SAVE BABY FROM FLAMES

Richard Cossi and Henry Gram
Find Infant on the Floor of
Burning Building.

HIBBING, Aug. 31.—Richard Cossi and Harry Gram, employes in the Geiser Cigar factory, 205 Center street, saved a baby girl from being burned to death this morning, when a fire started in a dwelling in the rear of the shop. Before the flames were discovered the fire had made headway in the woodwork.

Employes of the shop rushed to the scene as a woman staggered out of the building. She started to return but fainted. Cossi and Gram ran into the burning building and found the baby in a corner.

Cossi received several burns. Both men were almost suffocated by smoke.

The fainting woman was Mrs. Anton Epereneia, mother of the baby.

Children playing with matches in bed are believed to have caused the fire. The building, owned by Mrs. Stephen Geiser, was damaged to the extent of \$200. The fire was discovered by William Wilson, municipal court officer, who, from a window in the village hall saw the smoke and turned in an alarm. The building is occupied by an Italian family.
