the plot. Would Not Impair Picture. "The changes I suggested would

in no degree detract from the pic-ture." Commissioner Silberstein said.
"The producers have notified me that they will not eliminate an inch of the picture." Manager Morrissey announced. "The film has been passed by the national board of censorship and lauded as one of the greatest

pictures ever produced." According to City Attorney Greene's opinion, the city can only censor a play or picture that is immoral or obscene or would seem likely to cause a disturbance of the public peace.
