

INSPECTOR CONDEMNNS 5,000 POUNDS OF FISH

Single Visit Reveals Three Times
Entire Amount Ordered De-
stroyed Last Year.

More than three times the total amount of fish condemned in 1914, yesterday were declared "unfit" and "unwholesome," following a visit paid by O. Peterson, city meat inspector, to 440 Minnesota avenue, one of the storehouses owned by the Lake Superior Fish company. Samuel Goldish, manager of the company, requested the city health department to make the inspection.

Peterson's visit resulted in the condemning of 5,000 pounds of fish shipped to Duluth from North Shore points, according to statements at the city health department. Figures of the department showed that 1,580 pounds of fish had been found unfit for food in 1914.

Goldish said he requested the inspection in order to avoid being "stung again." According to city health officials the fish were almost putrid, and had been packed with an over-layer of fish in sound condition. Peterson ordered the fish hauled to the city incinerator.
