

VERDICTS RETURNED IN SEVERAL SUITS

Albert Glasser Is Awarded Nothing for Alleged Injuries to Daughter.

Four verdicts were rendered in district court yesterday, one of which was for the defendants, one for the plaintiff and the verdict of Daniel Hall against the Duluth & Northern Minnesota Railway company in Judge Dancer's court was sealed.

In the Harry and Sadie Richards damage suit against the city of Duluth, a jury in Judge Cant's court returned a verdict of \$175 for Mrs. Richards. This was the Chester creek automobile accident case of last year.

F. Q. Marchand, who sued the Duluth Street Railway company, for \$500 damages lost his suit in Judge Ensign's court, a verdict being rendered in favor of the company.

Albert Glasser, who sued Leonard McNamara and others for \$5,000 for alleged damages to his daughter, Eva, in an automobile accident, received nothing, for the jury in Judge Hughes' room decided in favor of the defendants yesterday.

In Judge Cant's room the case of Jessie Dewey Nicholson against Paul Von De Schoeppe, to recover the value of a \$655 promissory note given to cover a loan made to the defendant, was commenced before adjournment.

An order in favor of Henry Warner against June Warner for divorce, on the grounds of desertion, was signed by Judge Cant yesterday. Thomas J. McKeon was attorney for the plaintiff.
