Eighty Kindergarten Kiddies, All Under Six Years of Age, to Play.

PROCEEDS TO RED CROSS

More Than 400 Children Altogether Will Take Part in Affair.

VIRGINIA, May 8.—Eighty kiddies, all less than 6 years old, banded together in a harmonious musical organization, known as the Virginia Kindergarten orchestra, will be the outstanding feature of the kindergarten festival to be given Thursday night in the gymnasium of the Technical high school.

The festival will include concert numbers, embracing operatic and semi-classical selections by the orchestra, which has a large horn section, tambourines, triangles, traps and drums. Folk dances, May pole dance, flag and umbrella drills and other "stunts" have been arranged by Miss Eva Sorenson, kindergarten supervisor of the Virginia schools.

The affair is being given by the Virginia Kindergarten club and the proceeds will go to augment the Red Cross society funds. More than 400 children will take part. Costumes have been made by mothers and teachers which will aid in carrying out the fairy legends and other interesting "bits" that will be offered.

Today a section of the orchestra, kindergartners of the Johnson school to be more explicit, held a rehearsal in the high school gymnasium before a body of students.
