

Auto, Boys and Suits Missing; Police Find All; Court to Act

Youths Abandon Trip to Woods; Found in Chisholm.

CHISHOLM, Jan. 6.—His car missing and together with it a number of suits of clothes valued at \$300 and several sample cases, Louis Bernstein, Hibbing clothier, was puzzled when he emerged from his sister's home at 203 Walnut street, Chisholm, after having stopped there "just to say hello."

When Bernstein entered his sister's home he allowed the engine of his automobile to run, expecting to leave within a few minutes. But the car was gone and the loss was reported to Chisholm and Hibbing police.

Two boys, who were reported by their parents to have run away from home, were suspected by the Chisholm police as the culprits. The boys, one of whom is 17 and the other 16, were reported to have stocked up with foodstuffs preparatory to a winter trip into the woods.

Chief of Police Cloutier of Chisholm found the Hibbing man's automobile near Dewey lake, but not the boys. In the automobile were the sample cases. The suits were missing.

The boys later were found in Chisholm. They had returned, having abandoned their journey into the wilds.

The boys may be taken before the juvenile court here Saturday.
