

# *Duluth Hebrews to Observe Yom Kippur With Fasting*

The Jewish population of Duluth, beginning at sunset today, will observe Yom Kippur, known in Hebrew religion as the Day of Atonement. The observance will last until sunset tomorrow.

Services will be held at Adas Israel synagogue, Third avenue East and Third street where Rabbi Israel Lebendiger will deliver a sermon while Rabbi Alvin S. Luchs will preside over ceremonies at the First Unitarian church, Eighteenth avenue East and First street. Services also will be held at the Fifth and Ninth street synagogues.

The Day of Atonement during which sins are confessed and members of the Hebrew cult seek to revive their confidence in the eventual triumph of God's love, is observed by fasting and in prayer.
